Mayor Norman Itjen moved to approve February 6, 2019 minutes, seconded by Trustee Thomas Stempin and carried.

Kathy contacted the Genesee County Board of Elections to inquire about the old voting machine we still have. She was told that they were turned over to the Villages. Trustee Amy Vlack who is a member of the Historical Society stated that they do not have room for the voting machine. As the old voting machine is obsolete, Mayor Norman Itjen resolved to declare the old voting machine as surplus and sell it for scrap metal. Kathy spoke with Jeff Smith from Municipal Solutions about the \$1,100.00 the USDA is requesting we budget in Water Fund to put in the Water Equipment Capital Fund. He does not feel as if the Village has to budget the \$1,100.00 for the Capital Fund until the Fiscal Year 2020 – 2021. Jeff is also getting principal and interest amounts ready for the budget.

4243 West Avenue owes the Village for water in arrears. As they are on the Town of Elba's water now, the Village Board discussed options for collecting the arrears that is owed.

19 North Main Street property was shutoff due to water owed and vacant. Owner has since passed away. Since then a tenant has moved in and water was turned back on. Kathy will contact the Village Attorney on how to handle this situation.

The crossing guard directing traffic was discussed. The Village Board has decided that the crossing guard should not direct traffic and just cross students. A letter will be sent out informing the crossing guard.

Trustee Buczek uploaded the water regulations and minutes to the Village of Elba website.

Trustee Buczek suggested finding out if the Town of Elba has an easement from Torrey Farms for the sewer line on Maltby Road. Trustee Buczek is collecting more information.

M & T Bank donated money to the Historical Society, which would be used for new playground equipment in the park.

Dissolution of the Village was discussed. The process could take a year and half to two years. Jeff from Municipal Solutions advised to get the streets and sewer projects done before dissolving the Village.

Having the Town of Batavia do the water bills was discussed. They just do water billing not sewer.

Jeff Smith from Municipal Solutions met with Rick Albright from the Village of Albion and Jason Foote from Clark Patterson to discuss getting a grant for sewer upgrades.

There was also discussion on getting a grant to do the Village roads.

GAM disapproved 40-year agreement between Genesee County and the City of Batavia.

The Mayor is looking into outsourcing payroll.

As there was no further business Mayor Norman Itjen moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:05 PM, seconded by Trustee Thomas Stempin and carried.
